## Our Chairman's column

I sometimes come to the "roll-ups" AC and GC. I aim to be there just before 1.30 the start time for afternoon sessions( 1.pm in Winter) .I was surprised to see many people already playing and for someone less assertive than me it might have been rather intimidating to try to get into the game .

Start times are arranged so that everyone knows when to be there. These sessions should start on time and include everyone. I tell new members it is at 1,30 – they arrive to feel they have missed it.

I was playing at Budleigh recently and noted that they organise their roll ups(GC) ,which started at a set time -so that after about an hour everyone switches partners -perhaps something to try here.

## On the lawns.

GC tournament play got off to a cracking start on the 13th , 14th and 15h of April with our two Barter competitions- the trophy and the Cup .

The first , the handicap has been growing in popularity and this year was contested by some 24 players with good number of visitors . Here's an extract from a report sent by Russell to the croquet gazette .

“The Barter Trophy which is a Handicap event for handicaps up to 12. It was won by Stuart Smith(Broadwas & Cheltenham) playing off a handicap of 0. He won all his matches despite having to give away so many Extra Turns. The final was between Michelle Leonard & Stuart Smith. Will Drake ( Pendle) who is 94 also played in this event and played the next two days in the Barter Cup. This is a dedicated Croquet player!!”

The A level competition was fully subscribed with 32 entrants . Here's the report from Kevin Ham the manager.

The first A Series golf competition of the year, was won by Lionel Tibble, with David Trimmer runner up.

A capacity 32 players gathered over the weekend to play on eight of the lawns at Cheltenham. There were four blocks of eight with two going through to a best of three knockout.

Cheltenham members were out before eight o'clock to put the final touches on the fine lawns and to firm up the hoops.

It comes as no surprise that Tim King, Lionel Tibble, and Mark Suter, all had seven wins out of seven games in their blocks. Though, the star of the day must be Wendy Wu a six handicap who had four wins, including the scalp of a minus one player.

Saturday was a lovely day to play Croquet. Sunday was not. It started overcast and progressed with April showers.

Of those in the knockout David Trimmer (-1 at AC), was the most inexperienced. So new to Golf Croquet he did not have a handicap, other than -1, using the conversion table. In the final Lionel's experience showed through winning 7-4, 7-5.

The other matters to report are. Peter Balchin won the plate. Wendy is now a four, and there are still two places left for the Cheltenham GC Championship (Ascot Cup) in June.

### Cheltenham and "The Coles"

Also happening at the start of May (5th to 7th ) was "The Coles Championship " managed by David Magee . This is a senior competition for top players in the Country and attracting many visitors .The winner was David Maugham and the winner of the consolation event , Chris Williams .David ( Magee ) reports that

"As a stand-alone tournament, it was a great success helped enormously by the excellent weather and the strength of the entry – a third of the competitors had a handicap of -2 or better. The only action necessary is to ....limit the number of entries to 32. "

On the downside given the large entry and many of them visitors ,we could have done with few more members to help with the very many minor admin tasks to be done and to help man the bar . ( PLEASE SEE THE ARTICLE THAT FOLLOWS )
